# REQUIRED CONFLICT OF INTEREST NOTIFICATION FOR FIRE DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS UNDER A LOSAP

Fire districts have the authority to establish Length of Service Award Programs (LOSAP) or service award programs for their volunteer firefighters under Article 11-a of the General Municipal Law. These programs are initially created by a resolution of the Board of Fire Commissioners, subject to mandatory voter approval through a referendum. Once approved by voters, the established programs may be amended by the Board of Fire Commissioners, with certain amendments requiring voter approval and others not requiring it. This system involves the Board of Fire Commissioners in the approval process, where members may also be volunteer firefighters eligible to participate in the program. Under basic conflict of

interest rules, this involvement could create a potential conflict of interest for individual commissioners. In many districts, the majority of the Board may be volunteer firefighters and participants in the program.

Article 11-a of the General Municipal Law addresses this issue as follows:

5. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, no member of the governing board of a political subdivision of the state is prohibited by virtue of being a member of a volunteer fire company or department from voting upon a resolution authorizing a referendum on the establishment of a service award program if more than forty percent of the governing board would otherwise be prohibited from voting upon such resolution. Any member of such governing board voting upon such a resolution who serves as a member of a volunteer fire company or department shall publicly disclose in writing to the governing board such status. Such written disclosure shall be part of and set forth in the official record of the proceedings of such governing board. N.Y.

Gen. Mun. Law § 216 (McKinney). Thus, in a fire district where forty (40%) percent or

Gen. Mun. Law § 216 (McKinney). Thus, in a fire district where forty (40%) percent or more of the members are volunteer firefighters and members of the district fire department/company, the volunteer firefighter/ commissioners are permitted to vote on LOSAP matters. If less than forty (40%) percent of the Board members are volunteer firefighters, the volunteer firefighter/ commissioners cannot vote on the LOSAP resolutions.

In a fire district with a LOSAP program, volunteer firefighters/ commissioners should submit the following written disclosure to the Board of Fire Commissioners at a Board meeting. The disclosure should be read aloud into the minutes during the meeting and attached to the meeting minutes.

The written disclosure should be filed by a commissioner each time he or she is elected, appointed, re-elected and re-appointed.

#### **NEW YORK STATE DEFERRED COMPENSATION PLAN**

WHEREAS, the North Merrick Fire District wishes to adopt the Deferred Compensation Plan for Employees of the State of New York and Other Participating Public Jurisdictions (the "Plan") for the voluntary participation of all eligible employees; and

WHEREAS, the North Merrick Fire District is a local public employer eligible to adopt the Plan pursuant to Section 5 of the State Finance Law:\* and

WHEREAS, the North Merrick Fire District has reviewed the Plan established in accordance with Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 5 of the State Finance Law of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Plan is to encourage employees to make and continue

careers with the North Merrick Fire District by providing eligible employees with a convenient and taxfavored method of saving on a regular and long-term basis and thereby provide for <u>their</u> retirement:

\*A local public employer eligible to adopt the Plan pursuant to Section 5 of the State Finance Law includes: a county, city, town, village or other political subdivision as defined in Section 131 of the retirement and Social Security law or civil division of the State; a school district or other governmental entity operating a public school, college, or university; a public improvement or special district, a public authority, commission, or public benefit corporation; or any other public corporation, agency or instrumentality or unit of government which exercises governmental powers under the laws of the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby:

RESOLVED, that the North Merrick Fire District hereby adopts the Plan for the voluntary participation of all eligible employees; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the appropriate officials of the North Merrick Fire District are hereby authorized to take such actions and enter such agreements as are required or necessary for the adoption, implementation, and maintenance of the Plan; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Administrative Services Agency is hereby authorized to file copies of these resolutions and other required documents with the President of the State of New York Civil Service Commission.

#### Notice of Permissive Referendum

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Fire Commissioners of the North Merrick Fire District in the Town of Hempstead, County of Nassau, New York, at a regular business meeting held on the twelfth day of August, 2025, duly adopted the following resolution, subject to a permissive referendum.

#### Resolution #1

A resolution authorizing the Board of Fire Commissioners of the North Merrick Fire District in the Town of Hempstead, County of Nassau, New York to sell or otherwise dispose of personal property of the Fire District consisting of one (1) 2013 or 2014 Ford E-450 ambulance, which said vehicle is no longer necessary for any of the uses or purposes of the District at such time, and upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Fire Commissioners in its discretion may determine; said monies realized there from to be used toward the purchase of a replacement ambulance.

A resolution authorizing the Board of Fire Commissioners of the North Merrick Fire District in the Town of Hempstead, County of Nassau, New York to expend monies from the Apparatus and Equipment Reserve Fund for necessary purchase of a replacement ambulance, and associated equipment. Upon such terms, specifications and conditions as the Board of Fire Commissioners may determine. Said costs shall not exceed \$ 400,000. (Four Hundred Thousand Dollars).

Section 1. Pursuant to section 6 – G subdivision 7 of the General Municipal Law, the monies authorized for this expenditure shall be paid from the Apparatus and Equipment Reserve Fund.

Section 2. Any monies or sums to be realized from the sale of this ambulance shall be paid into the Vehicle Capital Reserve Fund, established pursuant to Resolution # 1 herein, thereby reducing the amount of monies necessary to be expended.

Section 3. Pursuant to section 6 – G subdivision 5 of the General Municipal Law, any monies received there from shall be paid into such Vehicle Capital Reserve Fund.

Section 4. This resolution is adopted subject to a permissive referendum.
